1	SPORTING REGULATIONS - GENERAL
1.1	<p>Title & Jurisdiction: The 2019 Trent Valley Kart Club Autumn Cup is organised and administrated by the Trent Valley Kart Club Ltd in accordance with the General Regulations of the Royal Automobile Club Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA) and these Championship Regulations.</p> <p>Motorsport UK Permit Number: Status: Motorsport UK Championship Grade: Type:</p>

1.3	Competitor Eligibility:
1.3.1	Entrants must be fully paid up valid membership card holding members of the Trent Valley Kart Club and in possession of a valid 2019 Motorsport UK Entrants licence. Competitors under the age of 18 must be accompanied by the holder of a Kart PG Entrant's licence who must sign on as Entrant of that competitor.
1.3.2	Drivers and Entrant/Drivers must be fully paid up valid membership card holding members of the Trent Valley Kart Club Ltd, be registered for the Championship and be in possession of a valid 2019 Motorsport UK Kart Competition National B Licence (Novice) as a minimum. or be in possession of the highest grade of national Kart licence or valid CIK-FIA International Licence, together with their ASN's written consent ((H)26.2 and FIA ISC Article 2.3.7.b applies); A competitor shall not take time off school to participate in motor sport without the prior written approval of their school. If participation in the championship requires absence from school, drivers in full time school education are required to have the approval of their head teacher and a letter stating such approval from his/her school, to fulfil registration for the Championship.
1.3.3	All necessary documentation, including appropriate licence and TVKC membership card must be presented for checking at all rounds when signing on.
1.4	Registration:
1.4.1	Competitors entered for the race meetings are automatically registered for the Championship.
1.4.2	There is no Championship registration fee.
1.4.3	Competitors may enter the Championship at any point during the 4 Rounds.
1.5	Championship Rounds:
1.5.1	The 2019 Autumn Cup dates are as follows: August 31 st & 1 st September 5 th & 6 th October 2019 2 nd & 3 rd November 2019 30 th November & 1 st December 2019 3 out of 4 rounds will count towards the Championship.
1.5.2	All Championship rounds will be held at PF International Kart Circuit, Brandon, Lincolnshire NG32 2AY

1.6	Scoring
1.6.1	Championship points will only be awarded for the A and B Finals as follows: A FINAL 1 st = 60 points 2 nd = 57 points 3 rd = 55 points 4 th = 54 points etc. reducing by 1 point per place. A driver who fails to finish in the A Final will be given Championship points according to the number of laps completed. Any driver who doesn't start the A Final will be given 22 Championship points as if they were classified in last place. This will apply equally to all drivers who do not start the A Final.

	<p>1.6.1 continued B Final 5th =21 points 6th = 20 points 7th = 19 points etc. reducing by 1 point per place.</p> <p>The first 4 finishers in the B Final will score Championship points according to their finishing position in the A Final. A driver who fails to finish in the B Final will be given a position according to the number of laps completed and Championship points will be awarded accordingly. A driver who fails to take up his position on the Dummy Grid for the B Final will not be given any Championship points. Any driver who is disqualified from any final will score 0 Championship points. In the event of a meeting cancellation, the organisers will attempt to arrange an alternative date for the meeting to be held. If this does not prove possible then 0 Championship points will be awarded for that round. In the event of meeting abandonment due to force majeure, such as track flooding, snow, insufficient first aid cover etc then the following will apply:- If all heats required to calculate the grid positions for the finals have been completed, then the Championship points may be awarded according to those grid positions. This may mean that drivers occupying the first 4 grid positions in the B Final will score Championship points as if they had finished in the last 4 places of the A Final. Unless all heats are completed, Championship points will not be awarded for the meeting. However, it may be possible to award points on a class by class basis if certain classes have completed their heats whilst others have not.</p>
1.6.2	The winner of each class in the Championship will be the competitor with the highest overall points. In the event of a tie, the driver with the most A Final 1 st places, 2 nd places and so on will decide the result.
1.6.3	Championship Points appeals will be in accordance with the current Motorsport UK Yearbook.
1.6.4	3 Out of 4 rounds will count towards the Championship.
1.7	Awards
1.7.1	Trophies will be awarded at every round in each class, for A Finals only for the top 3. There will also be an award for the novice in each class.
1.7.2	<p>The awards for the Autumn Cup will be for the first 3 in each class, subject to there being a sufficient number of eligible recipients of the awards, otherwise awards will be given at the discretion of the organisers.</p> <p>There will be an award for the highest scoring Rookie in the Championship in each of the following categories Cadet, Mini/Junior & Senior.</p> <p>Rookies are National B and Novice Licence holders. If you have already been awarded a Rookie Champion status in any category then you cannot become a rookie Champion again in either the same or other category.</p> <p>There will also be a Novice award for the highest point scoring Novice across all classes.</p>
1.7.3	No Bonuses.
1.7.4	<p>Presentations: Garlands (may be awarded) and trophies are to be provided for the presentation at the end of each race or at an end of meeting presentation ceremony. Prize money and bonuses shall be posted to the entrants within 7 days of the results being declared final after each round.</p>
1.7.5	<p>Entertainment and Tax Liability: In accordance with current government legislation, the Trent Valley Kart Club is legally obliged to withhold tax at the basic rate on all payments to non- UK resident sportsmen/women and account to HMRC using form FEU1, the quarterly return of payments made to non-UK resident entertainers and sportsmen/women.</p> <p>That is, to those persons that do not have a normal permanent residence in the UK. The UK does not include the Isle of Man, Channel Islands or Eire. This means that the organiser, the Trent Valley Kart Club is required to deduct tax at the current rate applicable from any such payments they make to non-UK residents.</p> <p>Under certain circumstances, it may be possible for competitors to enter into an agreement with the Inland Revenue to limit the Tax withheld. Any application for such an arrangement must be made in writing and no later than 30 days before the payment is due. 1.7.6	<p>Title to all Trophies In the event of any provisional results or Championship Tables being revised after any provisional presentations and such revisions affect the distribution of any awards the competitors concerned must return such awards to the Trent Valley Kart Club in good condition within 7 days.</p>
2	SPORTING REGULATIONS – JUDICIAL PROCEDURES
2.1	ROUNDS: in accordance with Section C of the current Motorsport UK Yearbook, 2019 CIK-FIA Judicial Trial and Trent Valley Kart Club Supplementary Regulations.
2.2	CHAMPIONSHIP: in accordance with Section C of the current Motorsport UK Yearbook and the Trent Valley Kart Club Supplementary Regulations.

2.3	By registering for the Championship all competitors, and their associates commit to the Motorsport UK Race 'n' Respect campaign and agree to positively promote and demonstrate the Racing Code, which is appended to these Regulations.
2.3.1	Where any reports of disrespectful conduct are judged to be well founded the Championship organisers may issue warnings or require remedial actions and/or report the matter to the Championship Stewards who may impose appropriate penalties which can include loss of Championship points and/or race bans through to Championship Expulsion and referral to Motorsport UK.

3.1	The Championship is open to the following classes, as defined in the Motorsport UK 2019 Kart Yearbook and in compliance with the 2019 Motorsport UK General Regulations.
