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1	SPORTING REGULATIONS - GENERAL
1.1	Title & Jurisdiction: The 2025 Trent Valley Kart Club Championship is organised and administrated by the Trent Valley Kart Club Ltd in accordance with the National Competition Rules of Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA) and these Championship Regulations.

1.3	Competitor Eligibility:
1.3.1	Entrants must be fully paid-up valid membership card holding members of the Trent Valley Kart Club and in possession of a valid 2025 Motorsport UK Entrants licence. Competitors under the age of 18 must be accompanied by the holder of a Kart PG Entrant's licence who must sign on as Entrant of that competitor. In the case of a driver who is run by a Team the PG licence must be assigned to the Team Principal. By registering for the Championship automatic parental/guardian consent is passed over to the Team Manager/Principal that the competitor is competing/entered under at that Event. The physical PG licence must be in the possession of the nominated Team Principal at signing-on
1.3.2	Drivers and Entrant/Drivers must be fully paid-up valid membership card holding members of the Trent Valley Kart Club Ltd, be registered for the Championship and be in possession of a valid 2025 Motorsport UK Kart Competition Interclub licence as a minimum. Or be in possession of the highest grade of National Kart licence or valid CIK-FIA International Licence together with their ASN's written consent NCR 6.3.1.6 and FIA ISC Article 2.3.7.b) applies; and A competitor shall not take time off school to participate in motor sport without the prior written approval of their school. If participation in the championship requires absence from school, drivers in full time school education are required to have the approval of their head teacher and a letter stating such approval from their school, to fulfil registration for the Championship.
1.3.3	 A Team is a commercial race company or racing team hosting drivers in providing race services or covered accommodation in the Championship and receiving financial gain where the principal is not also the PG Entrant licence holder. This includes the use of team names, team sticker kits and team race suits/clothing: A Team shall at all times uphold and respect the provisions of the Respect Code, the General Regulations and these Championship Regulations as may be amended from time to time and shall; (a) hold a valid Motorsport UK Entrant licence; (b) have at least £5 million Public Liability Insurance; (c) uphold the values of the Respect Code and all applicable Motorsport UK policies and guidance; (d) act in a professional manner at all times and not act or permit any member of the Team to act in such a manner as to bring motor sport, the Championship or Motorsport UK or any of its officers and officials into disrespect; (e) adhere to the Motorsport UK Safeguarding Policies and guidance documents, complete Safeguarding training when required and ensure that any person undertaking Regulated Activity is the holder of a valid DBS certificate supplied through Motorsport UK; (f) adhere to the National Competition Rules in respect of anti-alcohol and illicit drugs as well as Motorsport UK processes for anti-alcohol and illicit drugs testing; (g) nominate one member of their Team as the Team Representative at each meeting including but not exclusively for the purpose of all judicial proceedings at Events and who shall be present at all judicial proceedings concerning drivers entered under that Team licence in substitution for the driver Parent/Legal Guardian.
1.3.3.1	It is recommended the Team has: (a) a designated team member as a 1 st 4Sport, Level 2 qualified coach; (b) a designated UKAD Certified Advisor, and (c) be responsible for carrying out and documenting a risk assessment of their activities; (risk assessment management tool available)
1.3.4	All necessary documentation must be presented for checking at all rounds when signing on.
1.4	Registration:
1.4.1	Competitors entered for the race meetings are automatically registered for the Championship. Upon registration, Rotax/X30 Junior & Senior competitors may be allocated a 3 digit race number at the club's discretion.
1.4.2	There is no Championship registration fee.
1.4.3	Competitors may enter the Championship at any point during the 7 Rounds. Please Note Individual classes may be subject to restriction of entry numbers at the discretion of the organisers.

1.5	Championship Rounds:
1.5.1	The 2025 TVKC Championship dates are as follows:

	6 out of 7 rounds will count towards the Championship. For any class to be eligible to compete at an individual round a minimum of
	10 entries must be received in that class by the closing of entry date at the organisers discretion. Please refer to the event
	Supplementary Regulations for the entry closing date. Please Note Individual classes may be subject to restriction of entry numbers

1.5.2	All Championship rounds will be held at PF International Kart Circuit, Brandon, Lincolnshire NG32 2AY
1.5.3 1.6	The Championship will be organised by Trent Valley Kart Club Ltd. All enquiries should be directed to the Club Event Secretary Mrs

1.6.1	Scoring Championship points will only be awarded for the A and B Finals as follows:
	A FINAL
	1 st = 60 points
	$2^{nd} = 57 \text{ points}$
	3 rd = 55 points
	$4^{th} = 54$ points etc. reducing by 1 point per place.
	A driver who fails to finish in the A Final will be given Championship points according to the number of laps completed.
	Any driver who doesn't start the A Final will be given 22 Championship points as if they were classified in last place.
	B Final
	5 th =21 points
	$6^{th} = 20 \text{ points}$
	7^{th} = 19 points etc. reducing by 1 point per place.
	The first 4 finishers in the B Final will score Championship points according to their finishing position in the A Final.
	A driver who fails to finish in the B Final will be given a position according to the number of laps completed and Championship
	points will be awarded accordingly.
	A driver who fails to take up his position on the Dummy Grid for the B Final will not be given any Championship points.
	Any driver who is disqualified from the final/meeting will score 0 Championship points.
	In the event of a meeting cancellation, the organisers will attempt to arrange an alternative date for the meeting to be held. If this
	does not prove possible then 0 Championship points will be awarded for that round.
	In the event of meeting abandonment due to force majeure, such as track flooding, snow, insufficient first aid cover etc then the
	following will apply: -
	If all heats required to calculate the grid positions for the finals have been completed, then the Championship points may be
	awarded according to those grid positions. This may mean that drivers occupying the first 4 grid positions in the B Final will score
	Championship points as if they had finished in the last 4 places of the A Final.
	Unless all heats are completed, Championship points will not be awarded for the meeting. However, it may be possible to award
	points on a class-by-class basis if certain classes have completed their heats whilst others have not.
1.6.2	The winner of each class in the Championship will be the competitor with the highest overall points. In the event of a tie, the result
	from round 7 will be used to solve the tie with the higher result in round 7 being given the higher ranking.
1.6.3	Championship Points appeals will be in accordance with NCR 2.5.2
1.6.4	6 out of 7 rounds will count towards the Championship. Any driver who is disqualified from a Meeting will receive 0 Championship
	points and will be unable to use that round as a dropped score/round.
	At the conclusion of the Championship, a total of 50 bonus points will be awarded to each driver that has entered, competed and
	scored points in every one of the 7 rounds (finals) used to calculate their Championship points.
1.7	Awards
1.7.1	Trophies will be awarded at every round in each class, for A Finals the top 3 drivers. There will also be an award for the highest place novice in each class.
170	The awards for the Trent valley Kart Club Championship will be for the first 3 in each class, subject to there being a sufficient

	number of eligible recipients of the awards, otherwise awards may be given at the discretion of the organisers.
1.7.3	Other awards may be given at the discretion of the Championship organisers.
	No Bonuses. Presentations:
1.7.4	Garlands (may be awarded) and trophies are to be provided for the presentation at the end of each race or at an end of meeting
	presentation ceremony. Prize money and bonuses shall be posted to the entrants within 7 days of the results being declared final
	after each round.

1.7.5	Entertainment and Tax Liability:
1.7.5	In accordance with current government legislation, the Trent Valley Kart Club is legally obliged to withhold tax at the basic rate on
	all payments to non- UK resident sportsmen/women and account to HMRC using form FEU1, the quarterly return of payments
	made to non-UK resident entertainers and sportsmen/women.
	made to non-ok resident entertainers and sportsment women.
	That is, to those persons that do not have a normal permanent residence in the UK. The UK does not include the Isle of Man,
	Channel Islands or Eire. This means that the organiser, the Trent Valley Kart Club is required to deduct tax at the current rate
	applicable from any such payments they make to non-UK residents.
	applicable from any said payments they make to non-ork residents.
	Under certain circumstances, it may be possible for competitors to enter into an agreement with the Inland Revenue to limit the
	Tax withheld. Any application for such an arrangement must be made in writing and no later than 30 days before the payment is
	due.

1.7.6	Title to all Trophies
	In the event of any provisional results or Championship Tables being revised after any provisional presentations and such revisions
	affect the distribution of any awards the competitors concerned must return such awards to the Trent Valley Kart Club in good
	condition within 7 days.
1.8	Pole Position Election
1.8.1	Pole position drivers are able to elect to change their grid position to the left side of the grid. The Clerk of the Course must be
	notified on the Pole Position Notice Form as soon as the Driver reaches the "Pre-Grid". This form must be signed by both the
	Driver and the Entrant or PG licence holder where there is no Entrant.
	Note; any such election will only modify the first row.
2	Sporting Regulations – Judicial Procedures
2.1	ROUNDS : in accordance with NCR Chapter 2 and Trent Valley Kart Club Supplementary Regulations.
2.2	CHAMPIONSHIP: in accordance with NCR Chapter 2 and the Trent Valley Kart Club Supplementary & Championship Regulations.
2.3	By registering for the Championship all competitors, and their associates commit to the Motorsport UK Race with Respect
2.2.1	campaign and agree to positively promote and demonstrate the Racing Code, which is appended to these Regulations.
2.3.1	Where any reports of disrespectful conduct are judged to be well founded the Championship organisers may issue warnings or
	require remedial actions and/or report the matter to the Championship Stewards who may impose appropriate penalties which
	can include loss of Championship points and/or race bans through to Championship Expulsion and referral to Motorsport UK.
2.3.2	It is imperative that we promote the safety and wellbeing of young people and adults at risk. In addition to this all participants
	must be aware of their behaviour and conduct at all times, and abusive language and harmful behaviour will not be tolerated. Any
	such incidents must be reported to the Club Safeguarding Officer and/or Motorsport UK. The Motorsport UK Safeguarding policy,
